

# Convert Your Blog Into A PDF

There are a number of "blog-to-book services" that you can use to convert your blog into a book or PDF.

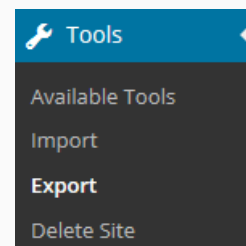
These are the steps to convert your blog into a book or PDF using [www.blogbooker.com](http://www.blogbooker.com)



BlogBooker is free to create three books with one year's worth of blog content using low resolution images.

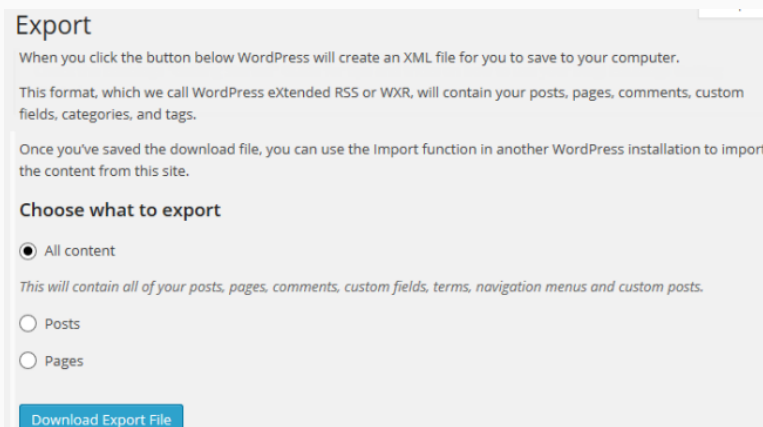
## 1 Export

Log in to your blog's dashboard. Go to **Tools > Export**.



## 2 Select Your Content

**Select All Content.** Or, if you only want to include posts/pages from a specific author or from a specific date range, then you can choose the posts or pages export option. Click on **Download Export File** and save the XML (WXR) file onto your computer.

## 3 BlogBooker

- Go to **www.BlogBooker.com**
- Click on **Make Your BlogBook**
- Select **WordPress**
- Choose **PDF or Word**



A PDF document is useful if you just want to print or save the file. If you'd rather edit and customize your book, you'll need to create a Word document.

## 4 Upload Your File

Click on **Select your XML/ZIP export file** and browse to locate the Export file you saved on your computer.



# Convert Your Blog Into A PDF

## 5 Dates

Select the date range.

You can select to go back 1 year for a PDF with the free plan. If you'd rather create a Word (Docx) file, you can go back 6 months.



The 'Options' panel includes the following settings:

- All (any date) [Not available with FREE plan]
- Reverse chronological order
- Columns:  Single Column  Two Columns
- Language: English (dropdown menu)
- \* From: 2016/06/02 (calendar icon)
- \* To: 2017/06/02 (calendar icon)
- Render "Pages entries" only (no Post!)

## 6 Additional Options

Select your preferred format and features (optional).



The 'Format & Features' panel includes the following settings:

- Comments
- Table of Contents
- Header/Footer
- Footnoted Links
- No Numbering
- Author of post (Multiple authors)
- New page for each entry
- MathJax support
- Paper: US Letter (dropdown menu)
- Font: Carlito (latin range) (dropdown menu)
- Size: 11pt (default) (dropdown menu)

## 7 Create Your PDF!

Once you have everything configured the way you want it, click on the **Create your BlogBook** button.



## 8 Save Or Share Your Document

There will be a short wait while your file is completed. Once finalized, you are taken to a page where you can download your PDF (or Word doc).

Save this file to your computer, email it, or perhaps print it as a gift for students or parents.
